Q1. Write down definitions of the following?

Adverb:

An adverb is a word that explains something more about verbs or another adverb. They answer the following questions; How, When, Where. For example 'I really got up too early this morning'. Most common endings of adverb are -ly.

Transitive and Intransitive Verbs: Transitive means to 'pass over.'

A verb which needs an object to convey its meaning completely is called transitive verb. For example I eat banana.

Those verbs which do not pass over <sup>to</sup> an object to convey their meaning are transitive verbs. For example smile, shout. He smiles. He shouts loudly.

Q2. Define the class of underlined words in the following context? (4marks)

Another difference among the world's seas and oceans is that the salinity varies in

different climate zones. For example, the Baltic Sea in northern Europe is only one

quarter as saline as the Red Sea in the Middle East. There are two reasons for this. First.

\* of all, in warm climates, water evaporates rapidly; therefore, the concentration of salt is

greater than that in cold climate zones, where water evaporates slowly.
